No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did.'

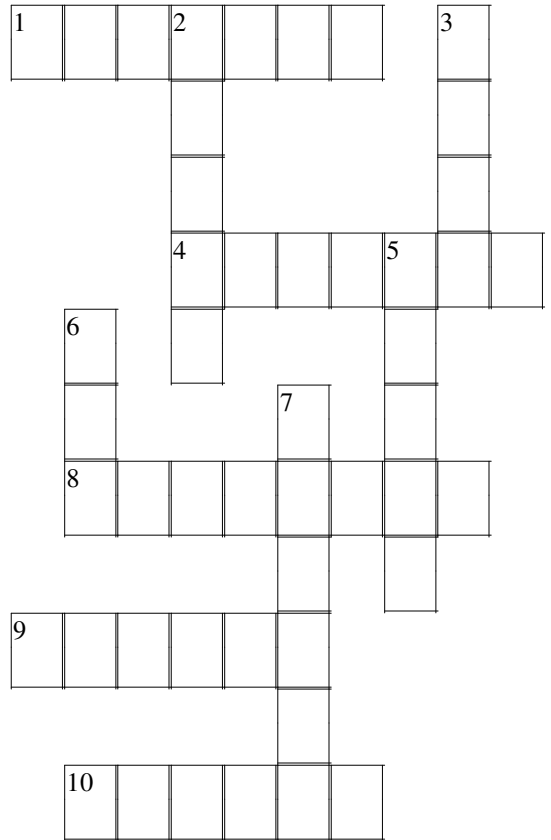

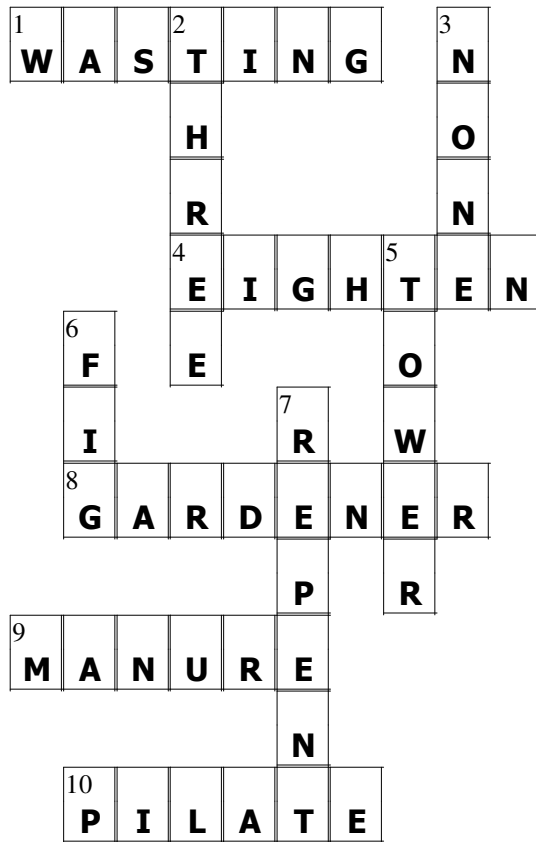
